

## REGULATION

### ABOUT THE IMPLEMENTATION OF MAJOR-MINOR PROGRAMS AT EKIBASTUZ ENGINEERING-TECHNICAL INSTITUTE NAMED AFTER ACADEMICIAN K. SATPAYEV

#### I General provisions:

1.1 This regulation defines the implementation of major-minor programs at Ekibastuz engineering-technical Institute named after academician K. Satpayev (hereinafter-the Institute).

1.2 The main educational program – Major, defines the main profile of the educational cycle in accordance with the curriculum of the educational program, but does not exclude the possibility of choosing an additional minor program for students.

1.3 **Major** ("major") is the main educational program (the main profile of the educational cycle in main educational direction).

1.4 **Minor** ("minor") is an additional educational program, the disciplines of which form additional competencies. At the same time, these disciplines are not core for the training direction, and they may be interrelated disciplines, or not related to each other.

1.5 The list of offered minors may include a "free minor" consisting of unrelated disciplines based on the principles of Liberal Arts.

#### II Features of minor implementation:

2.1 It is studied in the second and subsequent courses;

2.2 It consists of several disciplines studied sequentially when they are interrelated, or in any academic period when they are not related to each other;

2.3 Each minor discipline can be studied in several modules;

2.4 Minor "weighs" 15-20 credits;

2.5 It is included in the main part of the educational program (credits for minor disciplines are included in 240 credits of the main program);

2.6 It takes from 1/6 to 1/12 of the total labor intensity of the program;

- 2.7 It is selected by the student of each educational program independently from the General list;
- 2.8 It implemented by a specialized educational program for minor disciplines;
- 2.9 It is based on the principles of "prerequisites-post-prerequisites".
- 2.10 The educational Program may recommend certain minors to its students, but it cannot prohibit the student from choosing any minor from the General list offered.
- 2.11 The reason for refusing to study the minor may be the absence of previously studied specific training courses - prerequisites.
- 2.12 The Selection conditions are formulated in the minor program.
- 2.13 After attending three classes, the student has the right to change his choice and choose a different minor.
